

OVERVIEW - COMMERCIAL POSTAGE RATES (as of JANUARY 24th 2021)

Presort rates are based on worse-case “Mixed AADC” group – per piece presorted postage will vary.
 This rate is what you should probably use for rough postage estimates. Final postage will probably be a bit lower.

LETTER SIZE (1/4” thick)

Postcard Size (single panel): 6.125 x 11.5 or smaller
Enveloped Mail Size: 6.125 x 11.5 or smaller
Booklet or Folded Brochure Size: 6 x 10.5 or smaller

Letter-size commercially prepared First-Class mail (metered & permit imprint) is cheaper than Retail First-Class Mail (stamps).

Max weight for barcoded (automated) enveloped mail is 3.5 ounces
 Max weight for nonbarcoded (machinable) enveloped mail is 3.3 ounces
 Max weight for barcoded (automated) booklets & folded self-mailers is 3.0 ounces

First-Class RET/COM	\$0.360

USPS MM Non-profit	\$0.183 (same as USPS MM Non-profit <u>letter</u> rate)

FLAT SIZE (max size 12”x15” & 3/4” thick, **minimum 5”x7” some restrictions apply)

Postcard Size: Over 6.125 x 11.5
Enveloped Mail Size: Over 6.125 x 11.5
Booklet or Folded Brochure Size: Over 6 x 10.5

USPS Marketing Mail / Nonprofit rates for FLATS are based on ceiling weight of 4.0 ounces

When you go over 4.0 ounces there is an additional “per piece / per pound” rate.
